What is the Youth IDD/Mental Health Summit?

The **Youth IDD/Mental Health Summit** brings Oregonians together to strategize about how we support youth who experience both intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and mental health challenges. We envision an Oregon where youth with IDD and mental health needs are supported by compassionate, well-informed people and flexible, collaborative systems.

Oregon's systems are complex and often difficult to navigate. Many people are doing their best without shared language or strong connections across systems and roles. The Youth IDD/Mental Health Summit creates common ground, strengthens relationships, and supports clearer, more confident action to affect systemic change.

Who is the Summit for?

The Youth IDD Mental Health Summit is primarily for professionals across Oregon who support youth with IDD and mental health needs through their work in systems and services. The Summit also includes youth with lived experience and family members whose perspectives help ground the learning and inform systems change.

Our audience includes:

- Mental health and healthcare providers
- Educators, school staff, and administrators
- IDD Case managers, services coordinators, and system partners
- Advocates, community leaders, and policy-focused - professionals

Last year's impact

The 2025 Summit placed the voices of those with lived experience center stage. We hosted two keynote speakers and five breakout presenters, who collectively represented lived experience, clinical expertise, advocacy leadership, and legislative leadership across their six featured sessions.

We also debuted a sliding-scale registration fee last year to reduce financial barriers to attendance. This allowed **over 250 in-person registrants** to attend the Summit, and an additional **103 virtual attendees** tuned in to our hybrid keynote broadcast. This extended the Summit's reach beyond the in-person event, with recordings of the keynotes available for almost three months after the event.

This year's approach

We want the 2026 Youth IDD/Mental Health Summit to support collaborative learning and shared wisdom. We aim to elevate the voices of people and families with lived experience through:

- Interactive, engaging **breakout sessions** hosted by members of our community. Learn more about what we are seeking here: [Request for Proposals](#).
- **World Café–style tabletop conversations**, where participants can share ideas about how to improve outcomes for dual-diagnosed youth.
- A focus on **shared learning** between Oregon's IDD and mental health communities that serve youth and families.

By sponsoring the Youth IDD/Mental Health Summit, you actively support our mission of affecting change in Oregon’s IDD and mental health systems. Your contribution helps us cover the material costs of hosting the Summit, all while **displaying your support for Oregon’s dual-diagnosed youth** to hundreds of community members.

Sponsor funding also allows us to offer a **flexible registration fee** to those who may not have the support of an organization to fund their attendance. This minimizes the financial barriers presented by fixed attendance fees, allowing more people with lived experience to participate in the Summit.

Sponsorship and Exhibitor Options

We offer a **sliding-scale sponsorship model** that allows you to decide how much you will contribute and what you want to sponsor. This includes **directly sponsoring key elements** of the Summit – see below for examples.

\$7,500	Sponsor lunch for the event
\$5,000	Sponsor a breakout or quiet room
\$3,000	Sponsor snacks or continental breakfast

Exhibitor tables have a flat rate fee of **\$100 per table**, plus **registration fees** for each attendee. We are willing to offer reduced or waived fees for exhibitor tables depending on burden of cost and relevance of the exhibitor to the event.
